Future ready ports: Digital and energy transition strategies

Description

As strategic nodes of global supply chains, and in a rapidly evolving global economy, ports, which for many countries serve as the economic hubs, risk falling behind if they do not prioritize adjusting to emerging trends in modernization. This event will discuss the future-proofing of ports and explore strategies for enhancing port resilience while adapting to evolving energy and digital landscapes. It will discuss how solutions can account for local contexts to increase resilience.

Ports are major energy consumers and emission sources. They need to transition their energy mix towards more sustainable solutions. New business models and opportunities can support solutions for the green transition and decarbonization.

Also, the digital transformation triggers a new era of smart ports. New digital technologies enhance operational capacity by improving infrastructure, addressing environmental risks, anticipating changes, and boosting competitiveness through faster and more accurate decision-making.

In line with the policy recommendations of UNCTAD's 2024 Review of Maritime Transport, which press for continued port development through digitalization and decarbonization, this event seeks to enable the sharing of best practices, addressing the challenges linked to the energy transition and digital transformation, especially among countries of the global South, to boost knowledge for elaborating sustainable port strategies of the future.
